

Saddlebag Checklist

To help you hit the trail prepared, I have composed a list of saddlebag items that will handle most minor circumstances. Deciding what you pack in your saddlebag is a matter of personal preference & necessity, the items listed here is what I consider essential and "good to have."

Hoof pick – removing stones or other foreign matter from hoof

Hoof Boot

Duct Tape – you can substitute duct tape for a hoof boot.

Leather Punch

Baling Twine and/or Leather Laces – temporary repair for tack breakage

Extra set of Reins – in case a pair breaks or you can use as a tourniquet in a pinch.

Halter/Leadrope

Branch Trimmers

Pocket Knife

Flashlight

Insect Repellant – horse and human

Lip Balm

Water Bottle or Canteen

Raincoat – you never know when rain will pop up

Gloves

Cell Phone

Compass or GPS

Trail Map

Basic First Aid Items:

Non-stick gauze pads – clean and/or cover wounds

Antibiotic Ointment or Spray – prevent infection for minor scrapes/wounds

Vet Wrap – holds gauze pad in place and help protects wound until you get back to the trailer

Bute or Banamine Paste
